

homeownership program.

A home is so much more than just a house. It's a place where dreams are made, children can feel safe, and families can start planning for their futures. Because children of homeowners have a more stable environment, studies show they are more than twice as likely to graduate from college - compared to children in families who don't own their homes.

Many of these children, like Neura's, start this growth young. "My family and I will have a huge change. For example, my daughter is very excited because she is going to have her own room!" A Habitat home for Neura's family will give them a place to put down strong roots, study, and start dreaming - especially since earning her American Citizenship.

Neura immigrated to the United States, and since then, has been working hard in York Habitat's Homeownership Program to prepare her and her family to buy their forever home. "A home for me and my family is very important because we will finally have a permanent home forever. A place where we don't have to pay [rent, building equity in our own home]. We feel very proud, my family and I, to soon have our Habitat home. We're going to have the space to grow as a family. We are all really excited about this!"

Even since starting the Homeownership Program, Neura has earned her American citizenship. Success stories like Neura's is what unites us. No matter who we are or where we come from, we all deserve to have the power to provide for our families and build our own futures.

Since opening the first ReStore location in 2020, our business model has improved dramatically.

Our team quickly came to realize that the Queensgate location for a storefront was just not prolific for the business to live up to its full potential. Understanding this struggle, the decision was made to close down and search for a new home.

The Habitat ReStore exists as a year-round fundraiser for the organization, returning all profits made to help continue to build. The Queensgate location left much to be desired. It was best for us and the families we serve to move somewhere new. This location will be opening early fall this year.

celebrating 30 years.

Thirty years ago, five volunteers opened Habitat for Humanity's first-ever ReStore in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

Their vision was clear: keep new ad used home and building materials out of the waste stream while helping fund Habitat's home, hope, and community building work. Customers came from all over to find deals on windows, doors, paint, hardware, tools, furniture, appliances, and décor to spruce up their own homes while helping others build and secure theirs.

Whether you're a do-it-yourselfer or a construction professional, the ReStore is a unique place to find tools, appliances, and materials to help complete or inspire your next building or decorating project. And those finds, in turn, help build so much more. That's because proceeds fund Habitat's local work, so more families can build or repair a place to call home. In the last 10 years alone, Habitat ReStores in the U.S. have generated more than \$1 billion to further Habitat's work.




what we mean when we talk about housing equity.

The concept of housing equity rests on the principle that everyone should have access to safe, decent, and affordable housing.

But, access to housing is not an equal playing field.

In the U.S., historical race and class discrimination have produced deep gaps in generational wealth and a continuing pattern of segregated neighborhoods, as well as an enduring lack of access to credit and opportunities for affordable housing. All of this creates a significant lack of equity in housing and neighborhood choices today with Black people and other communities of color facing greater housing unaffordability and insecurity.

Harvard's Joint Center for Housing Studies' 2021 State of the Nation's Housing report highlighted the homeownership gap, with the percentages of U.S. homeowners by race/ethnicity as illustrated. Habitat's vision is a world where everyone has a decent place to live, and that means that creating housing equity is central to fulfilling our mission. To make that world a reality, we work to break down barriers, serve people of all backgrounds and create lasting change. Advocating for justice plays a tremendous role in addressing the critical issues that will help make housing more equitable now and in the future.

What's housing supply got to do with it?

Housing supply isn't keeping pace with population growth. Construction of entry-level, single-family homes has fallen from 418,000 units a year in the late 1970's to just 65,000 in 2020. The National Association of Realtors estimates that we now have a total shortage of 2.1 million homes for sale, with lower-priced homes composing the bulk of this need. Investing in the production and preservation of affordable housing and creating new tools that can help families achieve housing stability are critical to closing homeownership gaps.

Will you join us?

Equity and inclusion are hallmarks of any thriving community. We must come together to create housing equity and strengthen all communities. One way you can join us is through Habitat's advocacy campaign, the Cost of Home, which is designed to find solutions and create policies that will help families more easily and successfully face housing challenges, including the lack of equity in housing.


When we work together to create greater equity in housing, we have the power to influence and promote greater equity in other area of life, addressing the legacy of discrimination against people of color, especially Black Americans, and helping communities prosper and families thrive.

The Cost of Home campaign is celebrating its third anniversary this year. To date, more than 400 Habitat affiliates are working to advance policies that will help families across the U.S. afford the cost of home. Yet, at this moment in time, the affordable housing supply shortage has reached critical levels and the racial homeownership gap persists to this day. Everyday Americans struggle to pay for necessities as the economy weathers inflation and the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Looking forward, the Cost of Home platform will enable us to tackle the increased need for home affordability. We're calling on our partners, volunteers, donors, community members, and supporters to join us is easing the Cost of Home for individuals and families across the nation. Together, we can rectify housing inequities and create a healthier housing market with opportunities for all.
