Board of Directors: By invitation only. Please contact Natasha for more information.

The Board is ultimately responsible for the governance and executive oversight of the York Habitat for Humanity Affiliate. The volunteer Board oversees the Executive Director who manages the day-to-day operations of the Affiliate.

Faith Relations: Typically meets once a month, in person and/or on zoom.

Building long-lasting relationships with churches in York County, the Faith Relations Committee seeks religious organizations that will faithfully partner with York Habitat in fulfilling its mission. It accomplishes this through the Church Ambassadors, home dedications, congregational support and ongoing efforts towards our Faith Build projects.

Volunteer Services: Typically meets once a month, in person and/or on zoom.

This committee is responsible for the recruitment and retention of volunteers across the affiliate. It also provides oversight to ongoing engagement throughout the York County community.

Women Build: Typically meets once a month, in person and/or on zoom.

This committee is responsible for the planning and execution of weekly Women Build events, including: funding, hospitality, and recruitment. This committee is an extension of the Volunteer Services committee.

Finance: By invitation only. Please contact Natasha for more information.

Responsible for overseeing the monthly financial reporting, annual audit, investments, cash flow projects, and budget process.

Family Services: Typically meets once a month, in person and/or on zoom.

The committee ultimately recruits, screens, and selects homeowner candidates to enter into the program. Afterwards, a member may be selected to act as a family partner to educate and assist the homebuyers throughout the program and ensure timely completion. Members actively engage existing homeowners to continue the sense of community, prevent mortgage delinquencies, and to enable those helped by the program to "pay it forward."

Marketing & Special Events: Typically meets once a month, in person and/or on zoom.

Executes the calendar-based marketing strategy clearly communicating and promoting York Habitat for Humanity's mission in the community.

Oversee/designs the content of promotional materials, advertising, and the newsletter. Members also assist with planning, promo, and coordination of special events and fundraisers.

ReStore: Typically meets once a quarter, in person and/or on zoom.

The ReStore Committee is responsible for oversight on the operations of our retail operation, including: budget, expenditures, donation procurement, and marketing. The committee exists to ensure the success of the store.

Construction Volunteering

Our construction site is open to volunteers most Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays: 7:45 AM - 2:30 PM. As we welcome individuals to help through the whole build process, our volunteers can get a wide variety of experiences. Within a week of your chosen volunteer date, we can usually provide a closer assumption of what your task may be.

As of early April 2022, we have two units on Chestnut Street that are in the midst of drywalling. The other four will follow soon with insulation and drywalling.

Evidence brief: how does housing affect children's education?




Making direct connections between housing and its impact on children's education is challenging. However, studies have drawn a pathway between owning a decent, affordable, and stable home and experiencing positive educational outcomes.

When considering the role of educational attainment in generational economic mobility, children from families with at least two generations of low incomes are about 36% less likely to attend college than children from families with higher incomes, ultimately stunting their ability to make higher salaries as adults.

Children from families with low incomes who live in substandard housing are more susceptible to adverse health conditions. These negative outcomes impact children's physical, behavioral, and cognitive development, contributing to increased school absences and poor academic performances.





Households with low incomes move twice more often than their wealthier counterparts. Stable home environments raise young children's math and reading test scores, making affordable homeownership a conduit for greater residential stability. For adolescents, frequent and involuntary residential mobility is associated with negative behaviors, including social problems, delinquency, substance abuse and teen pregnancy, which research has shown to be correlated with poor academic achievement.

Socioeconomic status plays a dominant roel in negatively impacting students' edicational outcomes. As race and ethnicity are often predictive of income, Back and Hispanic/Latino families are more likely to experience socioeconomic disadvantages, such as: lack of wealth, inability to own homes, and lower educational attainment. They are also more likely to live in cost-burdened and inadequate housing and in high-poverty and racially segregated neighborhoods, stemming from historical discriminatory housing practices (i.e. redlining, mortgage denials, etc.)

The stability provided by Habitat homes allows homeowners to minimize disruptions to their children's education, which can help counteract the negative impact of lower-quality schools and limited community resources.
